July 4th Parade

This year Grand Marshalls are Ashley and Shane Stewart of Idyllwild Realty.

The 2025 Parade will start at 10AM and end at noon

North Circle will be blocked off and monitored for traffic control starting at 9am.

The Parade route will begin at the Four Corners in Fern Valley and travel down North Circle Drive, finishing at Idyllwild Park.

Road closures will be in effect from 9AM to Noon following the parade route. Residents and visitor should plan ahead to arrive at their destination as to not be delayed or re-routed.

This year there will be a wonderful magnitude of more than creative floats presented by local organizations. To name a few will be the Rotary District 5330 Governor, Samatronics Event Entertainment, Idyllwild Area Historical Society, and the always beautiful Idyllwild Garden Club. Some of the auto clubs will be touring which includes the Crusin A's Model A Club, The Corvette Club and the Jeep Club.

In addition, there will be the celebratory music from spirited marching bands. Also in line, there will be our very own Idyllwild dedicated community services including the Fire Department, Sheriff's Department, and the representatives of Mountain Rescue.

Chris Perrault will be driving the Grand Marshalls with Mayor Max next in the procession. In addition the American Legion Military Transport will be present. This year's parade will be quite grand and the crowd is expected to surpass the past few years. Once again the much loved UC Riverside Pipe Band (UPC38) will be marching, bringing the final note to the parade.

Traditionally, many will be setting their chairs up the evening before the parade. On the day of the parade, the Idyllwild Rotary members and volunteers will be available to guide the traffic and to aid in crowd control. Their dedicated goal is to help keep everyone safe while having a good time.

Would You Eat This?

Not to be confused with the differently pronounced Hawaiian dish of marinated raw fish, poke salad (sometimes spelled "salet" or "salud") was made of pokeweed, a wild leafy green that has grown in Appalachia for centuries. It was a simple dish containing the boiled leaves and stalks of pokeweed, along with bacon grease, and its preparation was crucial: Pokeweed is poisonous, so boiling the plant at least twice (with new water each time) was necessary to render the greens safe to eat. Because of the abundance of wild pokeweed and its association with toxicity, poke salad was primarily eaten in impoverished communities, and it endured as a staple well into the 20th century. In 1969, Tony Joe White's hit song "Polk Salad Annie" positioned the dish as an emblem of rural toughness and resourcefulness in the face of poverty. Nowadays, the easier-to-prepare and similarly seasoned collard greens have endured in place of poke salad, though there are some who predict that the local foraging movement may lead to a resurgence of cooking with pokeweed.

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

HEALTHY AT EVERY AGE

DISCOVERING POSSIBLE HEALTH ISSUES RELATED TO AUTOIMMUNE DISORDER by Kristy Frazier

It might surprise you to learn that most people have at least one Auto-immune Disorder, or AD.

If you are dealing with any of the following health issues, you have one of the 100+ AD's: Type 1 Diabetes, Hashimoto's Thyroiditis (hypothyroid), Graves Disease (hyperthyroid), Celiac Disease (gluten intolerance), Multiple Sclerosis, Inflammatory Bowel Disease, Ulcerative Colitis, Psoriasis, Eczema, Asthma, Allergies (food and environmental), Addison's Disease, Lupus, Vitiligo, Rheumatoid Arthritis, Osteoarthritis, Pernicious Anemia, Sjogren Syndrome, Myasthenia Gravis, Vasculitis, Endocarditis, Gout, Myocarditis, Pericarditis, Rhinitis, Sinusitis, Scleroderma (joints, lungs, skin), Raynaud's Syndrome, Pulmonary Hypertension, Rheumatic Fever. When told I had Hashimoto's Thyroiditis (low thyroid), I was not told it was an AD. That was about 30 years ago, and AD's were little understood. I was prescribed a pill to remedy the problem, that made sense because I was low, a pill would increase the amount that I needed. When the dermatologist told me I had Psoriasis, I wasn't told that it was an AD. I was prescribed a pill, but, based on the possible side effects, I decided not to go that route.

Over the years, even decades, specialists and medical researchers began to discover underlying causes of ADS. They determined that a person's immune system was attacking healthy parts of the body. OK, that's what the process is-but why? More research is uncovering the underlying causes of AD's and it is being found that our mental and emotional well being, or lack of, contributes greatly to AD's. It has long been known that stress and anxiety are bad for our health, causing digestive issues, headaches, depression, and may lead to alcoholism or drug use. Cortisol and adrenalin are released too frequently. Our natural responses to life's everyday ups and downs become overwhelmed and overworked, and a sort of burnout occurs. The immune system goes into overdrive and loses it's ability to distinguish between harmful bacteria/viruses and healthy tissues. It attacks healthy cells causing inflammation and damage, which then result in an AD.

Then, when I was six years old we lost our sweet dog Peeko. We looked for her for days, but we never found her. So, my Peeko, my constant companion and best friend, disappeared from my life. I was devastated. When I was 12, my Father died of complications from Type 1 Diabetes, an AD. We were very close. Losing him was, and still is, the saddest thing that ever happened to me in my entire life.

I started making a list of childhood experiences that caused some degree of trauma. I was very shy and introverted, never felt like I fit in, so school years were difficult. Then there was college, and leaving home to get a job and being independent. My list ended up being surprisingly long!

How do you feel about yourself? Are you happy with your life? Are you doing things that bring you satisfaction, joy and reward, or are you living for others, people pleasing, while putting yourself and your own needs in the background? Get your list started!

This week The Star features Larry Kawano. He is a prominent figure in Idyllwild, known for his contributions to science education and community engagement. He has a strong academic background, holding a doctorate in cosmology from the University of Chicago, a bachelor's degree in physics from Cornell University, and a postgraduate studies at CalTech. Kawano is celebrated for his ability to make complex scientific concepts accessible and engaging for diverse audiences.

From 2004 to 2016, Kawano worked at Idyllwild's Astrocamp, where he served in various roles, including instructor, assistant program director, and community liaison. He was instrumental in revamping summer activities, creating exhibits, and organizing science talks. His work at Astrocamp emphasized making science fun and relatable, blending humor with deep scientific insights.

Kawano is also an active member of the Idyllwild community. He has presented science talks at local events, including the Idyllwild Community Recreation Council's speaker series, where he has discussed topics like the Big Bang, black holes, and the universe. His presentations often challenge common misconceptions about astronomy and cosmology, using analogies and humor to captivate his audience.

In addition to his scientific endeavors, Kawano is involved in the arts and local culture. He performs with a group that recreates old radio shows, sings with the Idyllwild Master Choral, is a supporter of Friends of the Idyllwild Library, and participates in Tai Chi and hiking activities. He also serves on the board of Spirit Mountain Retreat, contributing to its mission of fostering spiritual and personal growth.
