


MHRC also operates four HAM radio repeaters in the San Jacinto Mountains. These repeaters are available to FCC licensed HAM radio operators.


MHRC can be contacted by attending a monthly meeting, or through its web site: https://milehighradioclub.org

TORRES MARTINEZ BIRD SINGERS by Kristy Frazier

The Torres Martinez Band of the Desert Cahuilla Indians have inhabited the Northern area of the Salton Sea, and the adjacent Santa Rosa Mountains for centuries. Bird Singing, and its traditional dances, are a time honored, age-old traditional ritual that they use to impart ancestral history, cultural heritage, and legends and folklore from their past. These songs chronicle their history and are sung to keep their ancestral knowledge alive for present and future generations. They also create their Bird Songs to teach about their local landscape, to connect to their home, and to celebrate. The term "songscapes" is used to describe specific Native American expressions that use traditional singing styles to accompany their native languages and instruments. The Bird Song rhythms are created with gourd rattles filled with dried palm seeds.


Through colonization, some Bird Singing and accompanying dances were lost because of Boarding School Policy, but fortunately many elders taught the youth these traditions as early as possible.

When I first heard of Bird Singing I couldn't imagine what it was like. Did they whistle and so make the sounds of birds? Did they use their voices to mimic birds singing? I was finally fortunate enough to attend a Torres Martinez Bird Singing and Dancing performance at the Idyllwild Arts Academy. Their songs are created by chanting in the traditional way that they express themselves with their voices. While the Singing and gourd rhythms were performed, women, men and children danced traditional movements that expressed the messages of the Bird Singers. And, the Bird Singers and Dancers do not accept money for their performances. They do not consider them to be "entertainment." They are a way of expressing their culture and ancestral traditions and history, not a way to make money.

In 1850, 60,000 Cahuillas lived in and around the Coachella Valley. By 1860, 50,000 had been killed by smallpox brought by soldiers intentionally distributing infected blankets.

In 2002, local water companies and the federal government allocated \$14 million in reparations for the man-made damages that led to the Salton Sea being created from Colorado River flooding in 1905, leaving much of the Torres Martinez land under water. The Red Earth Casino was built to bring in revenues to help the tribe members who stayed in the area.

October is Indigenous Peoples' Month, so look for lots of Native American activities and events to take place at the Idyllwild Arts Academy.

BEING PREPARED FOR EVACUATION

When evacuations are expected, and when time allows, give your possessions and your home the best possible chance of enduring wildfire by taking these steps:

Home Evacuation Checklist:

Before the Incident:

Ensure your property has passed the IFPD annual abatement and wildfire ready clearance inspection(s).

- Keep critical belongings in an easily accessible location. (prepackaged if possible)
- •Have at least 1 week's supply of your required medications (speak with your doctor about the possibility of a "standing prescription" for your medications)
- •Have a 3-day supply of your pet needs on hand including their medications and food.
- •Let us know in advance of any special needs you or anyone living with you may have.
- •Keep a list containing the names and phone numbers of your contacts and family members.
- •Have a pre plan of gathering locations with your family and friends.

When Evacuation Notifications are made: (tune to 1610 am WNKI)

·Follow the instructions of your official emergency service providers. (Fire and Law enforcement)

Hardening your Home:

- •Close all windows and doors. (leave them unlocked).
- •Remove all flammable furniture to the center of rooms, away from windows and doors.
- •Shut off your LP gas at the tank; turn off all pilot lights.
- •Leave your lights on so that emergency responders can see your home during dark and smoky conditions.
- •Shut off the air conditioning and furnace.




