#### **UPDATE**: Short Term Rentals - Ordinance 927.2 - 9/9/2023

A quick update on the status of our new 927.2 ordinance draft. 927.2 legalizes and regulates short term rentals (STRs) in Riverside County unincorporated areas. There is a new draft in town, and it includes unique rules for Idyllwild and Temecula Wine Country.

The county created a working group of residents and STR industry reps. We met through the winter to advise on a 927.2 that takes into account the outsized STR issues in our community. We were able to get some minor improvements put into the new draft.

On August 23, after hours of public comment, the county Planning Commission put forward their draft of 927.2. That draft now goes up for discussion with our county Supervisors. Our Supervisors, in the City of Riverside, meet Tuesday, September 12, but we are not seeing 927.2 on the agenda. I am waiting to hear back from the county Planning Director, but we expect the Supervisors to take up 927.2 in a meeting soon.

The Supervisors can strengthen or weaken the draft ordinance, so we encourage resident participation. There are a few local solution groups sending out updates and ways to help. One way to get updates is to join the Petition Group: t.ly/a7Ffy.



Interview with Steve Giove

As can happen on any Thursday morning in the summer, the presence of entertainers can be found at several of our local diners. The Star had the surprising opportunity to meet Marine Steve Giove at the Red Kettle. As we each finished our breakfast we briefly chatted about the upcoming evening concert. Even though this concert would not be the finale for the summer, this monumental event is traditionally a favorite.

# From Western to Swing - Jazz to Motown Idyllwild ICC and it's honored sponsors brought an exceptional music experience to town!

The Summer Concert is one of Idyllwild's favorite annual events.

A multitude of Marine Band lovers made their way to the Amphitheater with folding chairs in hand. Idyllwild's loyal concert goers set up their chairs in the early morning of the concert. After all, everyone had received the heads up from ICC's, Stephanie Yost, that the concert would start early and that the band had strict orders to leave immediately after the concert, to make their next destination.

Steve Giove shared that, "I had traveled from Atlanta, Georgia, to play tonight. I'm here on the invitation of Ken Dahleen and the Marine Band." "The first time I came to Idyllwild was the summer of 2008. That year we came to do the Summer Concert. Ken and I became good friends and kept in touch. expressed concern for children who were at home where the living conditions presented an unchecked danger of domestic and child abuse.

With the recent movie Sound of Freedom, and a few other documented films, there is a sensitivity to what is happening to children and young women, as they disappear.

Sound of Freedom gives us a glimpse of how children are being traumatized in such severe life threatening experiences. There are now more individuals stepping into the battle for these children. Those waring against human trafficking also face just

as much danger to escape as the young victims they are rescuing.

Many ask themselves what can they do to help in such a desperate and dangerous situation. At the point of freedom, where do the children go and what happens to the young women, once they are free?

Well, back to the Ladies
Room encounter, where I
met the woman with the
answer to these two
troubling questions, Rosi
Orozco, Director of
Camino A Casa, Mexico
City. The following
excerpt is from Rosi
Orozco's website Unlikely
Heroes.

(https:unlikelyheroes.com) which presents her profile as best anyone could.

Rosi Orozco works to recover and successfully reintegrate into society, victims of human trafficking who have suffered different forms of exploitation including sexual exploitation, forced labor, begging, humiliation, forced marriages and trafficking in organs. Rosi's struggle and main purpose is to free those who are being abused, with specific reference to children. Since 1990 Rosi has been dedicated to promoting and defending Human Rights through several associations, particularly in the prevention and treatment in combating human trafficking, crime prevention, social development and strengthening families.

Over the years Rosi has interviewed over 170 victims herself and helped to empower and enable them to move forward in their lives. She represents the voices of these women to ensure their story is heard by society and the authorities. Many of the women, with their identity protected, had the opportunity and above all, the courage to speak in meetings with authorities, schools, forums, media, etc., both to demand justice and making young people aware, as well as raising social awareness of how seriously this crime affects the lives of its victims.

## Lady of the Ring: A Chamber Ballopera

This Hobbit Day, September 22, journey to the East Kingdom for an enchanting evening of song, story, and dance. Spend the last evening of summer in a beautiful amphitheater at the **Water**Conservation Garden in El
Cajon. There, innovative classical production company Cinballera
Entertainment is putting on Lady of the Ring, a chamber ballopera based on J.R.R. Tolkien's timeless saga *The Lord of the Rings*.

The story will be told twice, first through song and then through dance. The opera is composed of diverse songs, including a rare song cycle commissioned by Tolkien himself, with words in English and the Elvish language from the books. The ballet includes original choreography to a piano concerto by Dmitri Shostakovich.

The whole show was arranged, staged, and directed by Cinballera's co-founders, sisters Tiffany and Rebekah Brannan. They grew up in Idllwild and received early singing and dancing training with teachers from Idyllwild Arts Academy.

Tiffany, now age 22, is an opera singer and professional journalist, specializing in film reviews, classical entertainment, and vintage culture. Rebekah, age 19, is a professional ballerina with San Diego Ballet, singing opera, writing fiction, and editing videos in her spare time.

A fellowship of nine performers will bring a concise, artistic take on this story to life. Led by the Brannan sisters, the cast includes talented professional opera singers and ballet dancers who have performed around the world. One of the singers, baritone Stephen Blavet, is an Idyllwild Arts alumnus who had the same first voice teacher as the sisters. The opera will be performed with live piano accompaniment.

Cinballera stands for Cinema, Ballet, and Opera, the three inspirations behind this unique production company.



Lady of the Ring wasn't based on the popular Peter Jackson films, though. It was inspired by the classic novels, which this program encapsulates like a movie from the Golden Era of Hollywood.

The Show will last around an hour and a half. Allow us to transport you to Middle Earth for one enchanted evening!



#### END OF SUMMER FRUIT COBBLER

#### Filling

2/3 Cup sugar
1 1/2 Tbs. cornstarch
4 Large pitted Peaches
5 Pitted Black or Red Plums
1 Tbs. butter

1 Cup of fresh Red Raspberries or Blackberries 1 Tbs. Lemon Juice

Combine in a medium sauce pan - sugar, cornstarch Mix well.

Stir in peaches and plums add butter until well blended
Bring to a simmer over medium heat
Cook and stir frequently (about 5 min.)
Stir in Berries

Remove from heat and add lemon juice to taste

#### Dough

1 1/2 Cup all purpose flour 1/2 Cup brown sugar (packed) 1/3 Cup sugar 1/4 tsp. salt 5 1/2 Tbs. Melted unsalted butter 2 Large eggs (beaten)

Heat oven to 375 F

Spray 2 quart casserole with Non-stick cooking spray
In medium bowl stir together flour, sugars, baking powder, and salt,
Stir in butter until blended, add eggs, mix until blended. Spread fruit
mixture into the greased casserole dish.

Sprinkle clumps of dough mixture over the fruit.

Set casserole on cookie sheet and bake on center rack
Bake 30 to 40 minutes until brown and bubbly.

Transfer to wire rack to cool serve with ice cream or whipped cream

You can use other fruits of your choice Try this recipe or text me and I will make this for you!



## Sarah J. Makowski: On Language and Writing

Dr. Sarah J. Makowski is a learning and development expert by day and a Jane Austen scholar by night. Her work appears regularly in Austen-related publications, and she speaks at Austen conferences in the United States and abroad. Originally from Michigan, Makowski lives in Germany with her teenage son, husband, two cats, and three chickens. (Amazon)


Sarah writes: Bitches and Bonnets explores parallels between Austen's world and our own, showing how modern social and behavioral scientists are just beginning to document and quantify what the author knows instinctively. Interweaving modern research and sociological experiments, author and Austen scholar Sarah Makowski looks beyond Austen's texts for the sources of female aggression both during the Regency and today. Despite incredible advances in gender equality, women still face discrimination and bullying from creche to career. The cruelest assaults are those that are least expected-from other women. Hardly a woman alive has not experienced a false friend whose opinions and affection bring both positive and destructive consequences. The very ordinariness of Austen's stories leaves room for us to identify with her flawed heroines and make peace with their enemies.





## Hollywood Therapists See Mental Health Effects of Dual Strikes

Depression, anxiety and feelings of "powerlessness" and "loss of identity" are taking hold during the entertainment industry's ongoing work stoppage. Hadley Meares (August 21, 2023)

If you know someone who is effected by this strike, you might offer some help and a hug. According to mental health professionals, there are ways to cope and even thrive during the strikes. "The way to survive as a creative person in a capitalist marketplace is to have a really good and positive relationship with your own skill set," (Palumbo says. "The love should be between you and your creative endeavors, you and your skill set. That's where the love should be."

While on strike, screen writer and showrunner Monica Owusu-Breen has attempted to reconnect with what drew her to storytelling in the first place, before the business of Hollywood took over. "I've been trying to find my joy of writing again," she says. "I'm writing things that maybe I can sell, maybe I can't. I remember that I got into this career because I love it, and writing is something I can still do."

#### Rosi Orozco and Trafficking - from pg 4

Previously, Rosi acted as Federal Deputy and President of the Special Commission for the Fight Against Human Trafficking in the LXI Legislature of the House of Representatives. For the first time in Mexico there was a Commission for Human Trafficking in Persons and to Protect and Assist the Victims of these crimes. This initiative subsequently became law in Mexico.

## CROSETTO UPDATE September 1, 2023

Dario Crosetto took time last week to write to The Star to bring more clarity to his 3D-Flow invention and his humanitarian efforts to bring the world hope in winning the fight against cancer. Very few individuals in this world are not effected by cancer. His loss of friends and family keep the drive in him ever moving to carry the facts to the world. Dario has faced physical and financial challenges to continue to tell the world there is an early detection source to save lives in the fight against cancer.

## The purpose of this letter

is to bring attention to a groundbreaking invention having the potential to significantly reduce premature cancer deaths and health complications.

#### Dear Reader;

In the interest of promoting scientific truth and advancing human well-being, I respectfully request you urgently send the 17 points highlighted in this document to experts you know in this field. The invention is the Three-Dimensional Complete Body Screening (3D-CBS) device, invented in 2000 and described in detail in the book (goo.gl/ggGGwF). It consists of a CT(Computed Tomography) and a PET (Positron Emission Technology) with a long detector, measuring minimum abnormal biophysiology, in a 2 minute, \$200 test at very low radiation, capable of detecting tumors having only 100 cancer cells in all organs of the body well before they grow to over 1,000,000 cancer cells, which CT scans, mammograms, and MRIs can detect. This technology, if implemented as described in the book, could save over 13,000 lives daily.

In 2020-21 experiments revealed, and scientists admitted, errors in developing PET scans taking beautiful pictures and suppressing the 3D-CBS measuring bio-physiology causing setbacks in advancing science, resulting in the unnecessary loss of lives and money. However, dominating scientists handling \$2 trillion per year in research and development did not fund the inventor of the 3D-CBS to prove his claims on a sample population. All individuals proposing solutions to reduce cancer deaths and costs should be invited to present their respective projects in a standardized table format, estimating the lives and costs saved every year for the next 30 years, similar to the one at (https://bit.lv/3ova8Tz). A public scientific review, akin to the one conducted for the 3D-Flow invention at Fermilab (goo.gl/zP76Tc) should then be organized to compare all projects, including the 3D-CBS based on their respective claims and potential impact on reducing premature cancer deaths and costs. In the absence of an alternative proposal submitting a table supported by calculations showing superiority to the 3D-CBS in saving lives and costs, and in the absence of calculations and logical reasoning that would invalidate my inventioncalculations-claims-estimates, as has been the case for 23 years, funding should be provided to the inventor to build two 3D-CBS devices to prove the claims experimentally on a sample population. Since the 3D-CBS was invented in 2000, more than 5,000 Italian DOD employees, 1.5 million Italians, and 40 million people worldwide have needlessly died. More than \$30 trillion has been spent on R&D; yet the 3D-CBS has been ignored, and the \$0.00002 trillion (\$20 million) has not been provided to the inventor.

Dario writes, Silencing my work on the 3D-CBS invention for over two decades-a potential tool for halving premature cancer deaths and associated costs-resulted in a catastrophic loss of over 40 million lives and more than \$10 trillion. If adequate attention paired with scientific problem-solving is given by decision-makers and experts, we can recover lost time and eliminate these barriers, thereby enabling the benefits of innovation to reach patients.

## Last Minute News!

Riverside County Mobilizes Quickly to Address Eastern Coachella Valley Flash Flood Impacts

MECCA – Riverside County today proclaimed a local emergency to respond to the impacts of the flash floods in the eastern Coachella Valley from Friday, September 1 that damaged and washed out local roads and the Oasis Community Park, and created potentially severe health risks to the community with the breach of the Lawson Dump.

The local emergency proclamation calls attention to the significant degree of damage and public health concern in the eastern Coachella Valley from the flash flood that dropped close to two and three inches of rain on communities within a short span of time Friday.

The following is an overview of actions that have been taken, efforts that are under way and collaboration between Riverside County and partner agencies to address the impacts of this local emergency.

The Riverside County Emergency Management Department began monitoring the storm as soon as it was alerted to it by the National Weather Service. Riverside County Fire personnel were in the communities on Friday assisting residents. On Saturday morning (September 2), Emergency Management Department staff deployed to the eastern Coachella Valley communities to conduct assessments of damage.

#### Lawson Dump

In coordination with CAL FIRE/Riverside County Fire Department, Emergency Management Department crews found that the flooding caused the breach of a dirt and rock retaining wall and berm along the Lawson Dump on Torres-Martinez Tribal land near Thermal, along Pierce Street and Avenue

Three surrounding mobile home parks are flooded with water and unknown materials, with the potential of severe toxic exposure to the residents. These mobile home parks, San Jose Mobile Home Park, Vargas Mobile Home Park and Gamez Mobile Home Park, have been under an evacuation warning since Saturday, September 2

- Within a few hours Saturday, the Emergency Management Department and the Riverside County Department of Public Social Services coordinated with the Galilee Center to open an evacuation center at the Galilee Center in Mecca. Evacuated residents will have a safe place to stay, meals and services
- The Riverside County Department of Environmental Health is conducting initial testing in the field and will coordinate to expedite results from the contracted laboratory. The goal is to receive results 48 hours after submittal. The department will contact the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to request its response and involvement, and seek further guidance for a complete list of potential contaminants for testing.

The Riverside University Health System – Public Health and the Riverside County Housing and Workforce Solutions Department deployed a team this morning to assess the community for health impacts. The Emergency Management Department has been assisting resources onsite with bilingual staff and coordinating requests to state and federal partners.

The Riverside County Transportation Department, the Riverside County Flood Control & Water Conservation District and the Emergency Management Department are meeting in the field with a contractor today to assess restoration plans.

Several roadways and exit ramps were damaged or completely washed away. The County Transportation Department has posted a list of road closures for county roads affected by flooding in the eastern Coachella Valley. These closures are: Hammond Road in Mecca, from Grant Street to Avenue 68

72nd Avenue in North Shore, westerly to Sea View Drive

Fillmore Street in Thermal, from Avenue 52 to Avenue 54

Pierce Street in Oasis, from Avenue 66 to Harrison Street

Harrison Street in Oasis, from Avenue 70 to Avenue 81

Johnson Street in Oasis, from Avenue 81 to Avenue 82

Van Buren Street in Vista Santa Rosa, from Avenue 66 to Avenue 62

Avenue 66 in Vista Santa Rosa, from Jackson Street to Van Buren StreetThe Coachella Valley Water District over the weekend worked on Avenue 76 and Pierce Street in the community of Oasis to re-establish access to the mobile home park, where the crossing had been washed out. This has assisted the county, allowing the county transportation department to spread its resources to address other flooding areas.

The flash floods on Friday came and went quickly but caused significant damage in the eastern Coachella Valley, a lot more so than from Hurricane Hilary," said Supervisor Perez. "The efforts of our county team and community partners have all to assist the residents who are having to deal with damage in their communities from this storm. There are many areas that were affected and that's why we quickly proclaimed a local emergency to seek any eligible potential federal and state assistance to support our repair and recovery efforts."TODEC Legal Center has assisted with outreach efforts to the impacted community Pine Cove and Wine Country, and they now have draft language of proposed changes to the Short-Term Rental Ordinance for the community's review and comment.
